The aim of this workshop is to help conservation biologists succeed at managing a genetic study.

By the end of the workshop you will understand:

1. Why you might (or might not) want to consider DNA analysis as a tool.
2. The range of situations that DNA analysis can be useful for.
3. What analysis tools are out there and what they cost.
4. How to plan a DNA sampling strategy that works.
5. How to collaborate effectively on getting the laboratory analysis done.
6. How to (start to) understand your data.

The workshop is aimed at those interested in using genetic analysis within their project, be they conservation management professionals or students considering a research project in conservation genetics. There will be time for Q&A and one-to-one advice.
